

# Are You Going to Heaven - Two Question Test

---

## Booth rules

If you use this test in a booth at a county fair or other public event, the servant should study the booklet to be familiar with it before the fair. There is an online version you can study that will give you some ideas on how to work each page in the test. In practicing the titles on each page correlate with titles on the online version. You can download the test booklet at <http://2qt.the-Gospel.org>

*2 Timothy 2:15 Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.*

1. Do not get into an argument with anybody.
2. Do not engage in long discussions if it ties up the booth's resources.
3. If someone asks, how we know our beliefs are true, answer is. It isn't our own belief. However, we are willing to show them how the Bible says they must get to Heaven.

*John 7:16-17 Jesus answered them, and said, My doctrine is not mine, but his that sent me. If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself.*

4. The *2 Question Test* is a guide, you can use your own examples and if your conversation is profitable it is okay to leave the guide altogether.
5. When person is impatient to leave the booth, let them go. If we force them to stay, the time may come when they believe they have heard or tried the narrow path (and it didn't work). If they have a bad experience at your booth, or are bored while you preach at them for half an hour, they will reject future attempts by others to reach them.

If we do our job right, we can at least plant some seeds. If they are not too impatient to leave, offer them the *Gospel of John*.

## Downloading and collating the test

1. Print the odd pages, then turn the pages around so that you can print the odd pages again. You can fit two pages this way on an 8.5 x 11 in. piece of paper.
2. On the back of the cover page print page1 (this is actually page 2), on the back of 2 print page 3, etc.
3. When you are done, you should have four pieces of paper (printed top and bottom) on each side. We use a copier to make as many duplicates as needed.
4. Next, take one piece of paper (one from each stack) and staple them four times in the middle.
5. Fold this down the middle and then using a paper trimmer cut into two booklets.

## Hints in using the test.

### Page 1

Continue to page two if person checks box 1 or 2

Go to page 3, if person marks box 3 or 4.

### Page 2

I like to warn the person that this is sort of a trick question since the right answer is not printed on the page.

You can take the test online to get ideas on how to discuss why each answer is incorrect.

Other reason: \_\_\_\_\_

If the person checked the box labeled other and believes that Jesus died for their sins, you may congratulate them. You may also ask them if they would like to take the rest of the test anyway. This gives you a chance to disciple them and confirm that they do believe in Jesus.

If they did not get the right answer, take them immediately to page 4.

### Page 3

Be polite; do not force a person to continue if they do not wish to, otherwise go to page 4 when finished.

Try to deal with issues hindering belief before we go on.

Even though a person may desire to believe in God, you cannot honestly do this by your will alone. For instance, if you are convinced that Santa Claus is fictitious character, you will have many obstacles to overcome before you believe he is real. Suppose I showed you all the advantages in believing; “You will get many valuable Christmas presents if you believe!” Still, no sane adult is going to believe in Santa Claus. The reason we do not believe is not the lack of benefits, we do not believe because the evidence points to him being a myth.

In discussing the questions on this page, we are trying to use apologetics to show that it is rational to believe in Jesus.

*1 Peter 3:15 But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear:*

Again, you can take the test online to get ideas on how to discuss why each answer with the person taking the test.

### Page 4

Read the page aloud to the person:

If they are not sure that they wish to continue, politely saying something like, “What are 5 more minutes if you gain eternal life?” can be helpful in regaining their interest.

If they do not wish to proceed, do not force them. Instead, you can leave them with a challenge or ask them to take the test with them. You may try to offer them a copy of the *Gospel of John* at this time.

## Page 5

If they wish to continue, ask them to answer the following questions.

Are you a good person? Yes  No  Sort of

- Have you ever lied?
- Have you ever Stolen?
- Have you ever used the Lord's name in vain?
- Etc.

This page is based on Ray Comfort's model; without seeing our sins we do not see our need to be saved.

These questions come from the Ten Commandments.

At this point, I usually tell them that to be saved by their good works, they must keep all 600 statues and ordinances in the Mosaic Law, not just the ones they feel like. Moreover, if God used man's standard for goodness, we would still have to lock our houses in the Kingdom of Heaven.

## Page 6

This page shows us that we have three problems. Many manmade religions try to deal with the first problem, but no man made religion deals with the other two.

1. Our sins have separated us from God and Just punishment being death.
2. Those who believe they are saved by their good works are very arrogant and we too would boast if our good works saved us.
3. God would be merciful if he forgives our sins; however, God is not righteous if price not paid.

## Page 7 & 8

God's Solution was to send Jesus.

**Who is Jesus?** It is important to establish that Jesus was God the Son, our creator, promised Messiah, and Lord who paid our price.

In addition, His **sinless** life and being the Son of God and creator of the world qualify him to be able to pay the price for the world's sins.

## Page 9

*John 15:13 Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends.*

I believe that it is important to stress that we are saved by God's ultimate love.

Then we see the cross solves all the problems mentioned on page six.

## Page 10

The way into Heaven, Three proof texts are used to show that salvation is from believing in God or having 'Faith' in God.

You can point out to the person taking the test that if they do not believe Jesus rose again, than how can we?

*Galatians 3:6 Even as Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness.*

## Page 11

If you are thankful, God expects you to live worthy of him.

This is not salvation by works, for instance in Matthew 18:23-35 Jesus told the parable of a servant who owed ten thousand talents. For that servant to be saved by his 'good works' he would have to pay the ten thousand talents. To be forgiven his huge debt he had to act worthy, that is, forgive his fellow servants.

Jesus plainly taught that the three conditions mention on page 11 were to be expected of those who he would forgive.

It is important point to make at this time is that what we believe does affect how we act. Give examples in your own life.

*James 2:20 But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead?*

I use an example of gold being buried in my front yard. If I really did believe there was some gold buried in my front yard, you would see it in my works. If I really believed that Jesus died a horrible death for my sins, you would see my gratefulness.

## Page 12

You can say out loud: "If you do, then your proper response will be thankfulness." To the extent they understand and agree you can see if they believe. If they affirm their belief and desire to be saved at this point. Lead them in the following prayer.

Exact words of the sinner's prayer are not important. It is important that they believe, if they do not believe, saying the sinner's prayer is not a fire insurance policy.

If they say no, they do not believe. The person who does not believe can be gently shown that by not believing they are making God a liar.

*1 John 5:10 He that believeth on the Son of God hath the witness in himself: he that believeth not God hath made him a liar; because he believeth not the record that God gave of his Son*

## Page 13 & 14

### *Some final points as they begin walking with Jesus*

Go over the points on page 13 and 14.

You can add anything to the list that you have found to be useful in your own walk with God. The online version of the test (because there were no space limitations) has added a few additional points.

## Back cover

You can explain this parable to them, stressing that their friends may discourage them as soon as they leave our booth.

**Write your Name and an email address** in the space provided so the person can contact you later with more questions. Give your phone number if you are comfortable doing so. Very young or inexperienced people in the booth can give their parents or pastor's contact info.

Finally – Offer them a Bible, New Testament or Gospel of John and do not forget to invite them to your church. ☺

When I hand them a Bible I tell them about William Tyndale who was burned at the stake for translating it into English so the common people could read it.

I then ask them, “What is in here that he was willing to die for so you could read it? And what is in this book that those people did not want you to read, and were even willing to burn someone at the stake to keep you from reading it?”
